Bulky Collection Appointments Available

The City of Kansas City's bulky item collection program is for disposal of large household items that cannot be handled in the regular weekly trash collection. For our neighborhood, the bulky item pickup days are on the first and fourth trash day of every month. Therefore, for September the bulky item pickup days are September 3 and 24, for October they are October 1 and 22, and so forth.


Items are only picked up on appointment. You can make an appointment by calling 311 or (816) 513-1313 or by scheduling the pickup online by visiting www.kcmo.org, then selecting E-Services, City Services, and Bulky Item Collection.

The bulky item collection program accepts such items as refrigerators, freezers and air conditioning units; metal appliances such as stoves,

dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, water heaters, and furnaces; furniture such as couches, tables, chairs, TV's, beds, mattresses and metal furniture; and other items such as bathroom fixtures, cabinets, rugs, lawn mowers and metal fencing.

The program does accept storm windows and glass panes, but to help prevent injury, place a large "X" of masking tape across glass panes to prevent shattering and stack them separately from other bulky items.

The bulky item collection program does not accept trash in bags or boxes; commercial or business trash or waste materials, including trash or waste from businesses conducted in or from a residence; piles of trash or bags or boxes of smaller items; loose or scattered materials; closed drums or fuel tanks (metal drums must have both ends removed to be collected); automobile bodies or gas tanks; or loose building materials and lumber.

Now it is time to start getting the kids ready to go back to school and you can give them all the tools they need for another successful school year.

You are probably already getting together the pens, pencils crayons, paper, and more. But have you given them the most important tool, which is *awareness?*

Many children walk to local schools or bus stops to head off for

their days of learning. Let's look at some ways to protect against the hazards that kids face on their journey.

There are many busy streets in the metro area so plan a route that keeps them away from busy intersections.

Identify safe places along the route that children can go to for help if something goes wrong.

Get involved in a "Walking School Bus" program that has an adult along for the "ride". If your child has



Police Dep't Offers Citizens Police Academy

Have you ever wondered what it's like inside of a Tactical Squad armored vehicle? Or how crime scene investigators dust for fingerprints? Or what kind of firearms training officers go through? Or do you just want to know more about how the Kansas City Police Department works?

Then you should sign up for the fall session of the Kansas City Police Department's Citizens Police Academy.

This free, 10-week course starts September 10 and meets every Thursday evening for a few hours at the state-of-the-art police academy at 6885 N.E. Pleasant Valley Road. Participants also take field trips to places like the Helicopter and Canine Units, Bomb and Arson Unit and the Kansas City Regional Crime Laboratory. Ex-

perienced police officers and instructors offer briefings, demonstrations, and engage in frank discussions about police operations with class participants. All participants also will go on a ride-along with a patrol officer.


Topics covered during the Citizens Police Academy include overviews of our department structure, information on police recruiting and training and hands-on workshops in various areas. Some of the areas explored include Accident Investigation, Bomb & Arson, Criminal Investigations, Firearms Training, Helicopter Unit, Homicide, Hostage Negotiation, K-9 Unit,

Narcotics Investigations, Police Dispatch - 911 Service, Tactical Response Teams and Vice Investigations. The Citizens Police Academy operates on the premise that informed, educated residents will be more supportive of police officers and promote safety in their communities. Admission to the program is open to anyone 18 or older who has a good standing in the community and is a resident of or works in the City of Kansas City, Missouri. Each applicant must pass a thorough background investigation.

Apply now, because the class fills up quickly. You can download the application from the Police Department's website at http://www.kcpd.org/kcpd2004/trainig/CPA%20 Academy%20Application.pdf and follow the instructions for submitting it on the form.




