#### VANDALS DAMAGE ISLAND, OTHER AFHA PROPERTY



Some time between August 2 and August 3, the urn on the island at 68th and Wornall was toppled from its foundation and broken into pieces. Hank VanArsdale, chair of the Fountains Committee, reported the damage to the Board, saying that he believed the damage may have been the work of vandals as he

Residents may remember that in June 2010 the same statuary was destroyed by a driver on Wornall Road. That driver's insurance paid for the damage. This time, however, no witnesses have come forward. Because the AFHA pays for maintenance to our city-owned parks and islands, we will have to pay for repairs from association dues — which are of course collected from our residents. The chair of the Parks & Islands Committee, Jane Aylward, spends many hours contacting qualified repair specialists, getting bids for work and supervising the same.

Our parks and islands have long been the target of vandalism. For instance, in the past, vandals knocked over the fountain at 68th and Wornall during graduation time, and several other parks and islands have sustained similar or worse damage. The AFHA Board of Directors would like to ask that all residents remain vigilant and report suspicious activity to both Chesley Brown and the KCMO police. S.C. ◊

### **MONEY MATTERS: Treasury Report**

**Money Matters: FAQs** 

The Treasurer and other members of the Board of Directors are sometimes asked questions about how Association monies are handled. In this issue, I address two common questions.

**Q:** Why do we send our Armour Fields Homes Association checks to The Homes Association of Kansas City?

**A:** The Homes Association of Kansas City ("HAKC") is a non-profit organization established by JC Nichols to assist homes associations in and around Kansas City with monthly financial reports, payment of association expenses, preparing dues invoices, depositing and accounting of homeowners' dues payments, maintenance of association databases, preparing delinquency reports, fielding and tracking neighborhood complaints, and sending welcome packets to new owners.

**Q:** What assurance does the association have that the board doesn't misappropriate funds?

**A:** Only the Treasurer of the Armour Fields Homes Association and the Executive Director of the HAKC have direct access to the Association's funds. Should a board member misappropriate Association funds, the AFHA carries a general liability insurance policy that provides \$120,000 in dishonesty coverage, which is in excess of the Association's assets. All AFHA revenues are sent directly to the HAKC for deposit in the association's bank account. Also, no revenue checks are ever written to a board member. For instance, all checks that pay for advertising in the Armour Star are made out to the AFHA, not to the Editor or Treasurer. The Treasurer of the AFHA reviews the Association's financials and compares all expenditures to the Boardapproved annual budget for reasonableness. An annual financial audit performed by a local CPA firm provides further assurances. The Board is not aware of any suspected or actual fraud.

#### PARKING IN THE AFHA

Here are some of the current parking issues in the association:

#### **On-Street Parking**

When cars are parked on both sides of already narrow streets, they can block through traffic. In some cases, residents have been unable to turn onto Edgevale from Gregory due to the number of cars parked near the intersection. Please be aware that Section 70-528 of the KCMO City Ordinances requires that a minimum of ten feet of the width of the roadway be available for cars to pass between parked vehicles.

#### **Dangers to Children**

It is very easy for a child to dart between parked cars to retrieve an errant ball. There are many active children in the AFHA, so watch out for our young residents.

#### **Abandoned Vehicles**

City Ordinance Section 70-641 defines an abandoned vehicle as one that has been parked on a street for more than 48 hours, not a long time. (Vehicles which are moved even for a short time over the two-day period are not considered abandoned.) If a resident reports such a vehicle, the police department or other official entity has the right to remove and impound the vehicle and fine its owner.

#### **Property Crime**

The AFHA does sometimes experience property crime, and leaving your car on the street invites trouble. Also, a car parked on the street is more susceptible to being hit by another car. Be careful and vigilant.  $\diamond$

#### HELP US NOT SPEND YOUR DUES!




# DO YOU KNOW THIS FAMOUS BROOKSIDER?

### A NOTE ON AFHA YARD WASTE PICK-UP

If you pay the extra portion of your homes association dues, you can request extra services from our security provider, Chesley Brown. Here are some of the extras you can request:


- Going out of town? You can ask Chesley Brown to perform extra checks on your residence. They will actually check your windows and doors!



#### SAFE AND SECURE

Every quarter we include this column in the newsletter to inform neighbors of security issues in our great homes association. My intent is to cover as much as possible and provide tips to prevent our residents from being victims of the latest crime trends. With that said, there are always different types of crime so it is best to be proactive, look at many scenarios and maintain open lines of communication with your neighbors.

Our block captain program is a great tool to disseminate information and to properly vet information through security and the police department. In the last issue when we asked residents to consider what information to send out, our intent was to make sure that the information is relevant, current and correct. We in no way were suggesting that residents not report issues. We don't want residents to be alarmed about situations that happened years ago and be looking out for suspects that are no longer of concern. This takes away from awareness of current issues. Prior to sending out any notices about crimes and trends, we always check with the police or security to make sure tips are accurate.

In the past several months there have been several burglaries in our neighborhood and surrounding neighborhoods. During the course of these crimes, the criminals have been kicking doors open in broad daylight.

There are no 100% solutions to this situation, but a few tips that you can follow will help prevent these break-ins. Setting your alarm any time you leave is a good first step. Installing reinforcing hardware to your doors will make it more difficult to break in. Also, inform your neighbors if you are going to have people in to work on your home. In many situations neighbors may mistake a burglar for a worker doing some type of maintenance on your home.

Another trend to watch out for is the theft of wheels from vehicles. In these thefts the teams of criminals jack up a vehicle, leaving it on landscaping blocks. Many of these crimes can be prevented by making your vehicles inaccessible: put them in your garage or leave them inside a locked fence. Also, special locking lugnuts are available and should be used to make it more difficult to get to your vehicle.◊


