Got an itchy green thumb & hungry squirrels?

In June 2010 the city of Kansas City MO passed an ordinance amending codes to better address "Urban Agriculture." For the first time it is legal for gardeners, farmers, and community gardens to sell their produce in residential neighborhoods. Are you curious about the "Home Garden" endeavors cropping up in our Brookside environs? Here's a short explanation of what is a "Home Garden."

The homeowner/occupant and family/housemates live on-site, maintain a garden on-site and eat the produce or sell/donate it.

There is no size restriction in the definition of a "home garden."

The produce must be whole, uncut, fresh food grown on-site in the home garden. No processed goods, or crafts, or any other nongarden product may be sold.

The produce can sell only between May 15 and October 15. During the time of sales an non-illuminated sign, no larger than 6 square feet or 3 feet high on-site may be posted.

Home gardens are not allowed to grow row crops in the property's front yard. "Row Crops" are defined as grain, fruit or vegetable



plants over 24 inches in height and grow in rows. Row crops do not include trees, bushes, or scrubbery. Row crops can be grown in a 5-foot wide border along the property lines.

Help rid your street of potholes.

Potholes are annoying and can cause costly damage to your vehicle. With your help, we can get our neighborhood streets back in tip-top condition.

If you have a pothole or other road damage that requires city repair on your street, call 3II, press "3" in the prompt then wait for a representative. The rep. will put in a request for repair service and give you a case number so you can track the status.

Or, you can easily request service online via www.kcmo.org/action. Click on "Request a service" (found under "Online services" to the right side of the page), click on "Category" and select "Street Maintenance," then click on "Service" and select "Pothole," click on "Continue." You will be asked to provide location information, click on "Continue." Fill in the required location fields and click "Submit Request." Your order will be given a case number so you may track the status online at www.kcmo.org/action (click on "Case status" under "Online Services") or by calling 311.
