Fall is just around the corner, and now is the time to begin thinking about sprucing up your yard. The hot, dry summer was particularly brutal on grass, bushes, and trees. September to early October is one of the best times to reseed your yard. If you are not a DIY person, there are several companies available to do this type of

work. With respect to trees, there are several dead or dying trees on homeowner properties in Northwood Trails. The City of Olathe reminds all of us that these trees are potentially unsafe and that they should be removed in a timely manner. In most cases in Northwood Trails, property lines go well beyond the fence line. Please remember it is every property owner's responsibility to maintain outside the fence as well as inside. Mowing, trimming, and weeding along the fence will help keep our neighborhood looking its best. Even if you do not see the outside of your fence, there are many that do. Be reminded also that grass and weeds taller than eight inches is a violation of city code, whether it be in the yard proper or outside the fence.

The next board meeting will be held Tuesday, September 13 at 7 p.m. at Grace UMC. The first 30 minutes is available for member input. Our board and committee members are already thinking about 2023 budgets, and we will continue working on those at the next two board meetings.

Path replacement has begun. Letters were sent to homeowners along affected trails prior to the work starting.

This fall, we will be removing dead and dying trees, as well as doing major pruning of trees in our common areas.

Take a walk around your property, including behind your fence, if you have one. Each homeowner is responsible for removing severely diseased, damaged or dead trees from their property, because they are a fire hazard. Also, do you have out-of-control weeds? Are branches resting on the top of a fence? They should be removed. Proper care of your landscaping and trees helps maintain our property values.

Lawn Maintenance - Olathe Municipal; Code Chapter 6.09.050

- Grass and weeds may not exceed eight inches in height.
- Property owners must maintain adjacent rights-of way and easement areas within property lines.

Tree Maintenance - Olathe Muniocipal Code Chapter 12.16.020

- Severely damaged, dead or diseased trees must be removed.
- Limbs hanging lower than 13.5 feet over a street or 10 feet over a sidewalk must be trimmed.

Should you see sprinklers running anywhere in Northwood Trails, after 10 a.m. any day, call Gerry, immediately at 913-894-0154. Our sprinklers are set to run 2 a.m. to 10 a.m. Do you see an area in our common areas that needs attention?

Pond Committee News

Greetings Northwood Trailians!

It's been two very hot months since the last update, but you might not know it just by looking at the pond. That's because the water's been clean and clear of algae this summer, in sharp contrast to the green masses that popped up in previous summers.

That partly a result of the bubbler system installed earlier this summer, comprising of an air compressor that supplies three units on the pond floor that sends thousands of tiny bubbles per second to the surface, pulling along the surrounding water. The result is all the pond's water is aerated over a 24-hour period.

A subcommittee of your volunteer pond team has also kept active distributing inputs that keep the water clear, break down leaves and other natural debris on the pond floor, and control weeds that grow in the water near the banks. Thanks to the bubblers, the pond required fewer such applications this summer compared to 2021, a trend we hope continues in 2023 as the bubblers will be active earlier in the season.

Neighbors who have taken a stroll, a jog, or a canine exercise session in the pond area may have noticed a new look at the dock. During a late-July workday, the pond committee replaced some wayward wood on the dock floor and benches. That work was in anticipation of a now-completed project that included powerwashing and the professional application of a clear sealant in early August.

The wood floor installed by your pond team in 2018 and the new railing, pergola, and entryway completed by a contractor in 2020 now have a

uniform look and are protected from weather deterioration. A local neighborhood contractor was hired to powerwash the surfaces and apply the sealant to the neighborhood showpiece often seen in real estate listings.

Neighbors, come down to check out the work and enjoy the unique Northwood Trails water feature. There's a generous handful of fish feed available for a quarter, and the hundreds of little fish and several hungry turtles are typically happy to oblige.

Other recent committee activity includes installation of permanent wiring for the new equipment and cleanup of debris around the pond drain. Upcoming projects include improving the cabling system securing the dock to the dam and replacing uneven asphalt where the trail meets the dock.
