One thing to keep in mind is our neighborhood has one of the lowest dues in the entire area. Keeping our dues low has been a consistent mainstay in our neighborhood. The reason we can keep our dues low is because of the many volunteers we have working behind the scenes. We could sure use more volunteers not only as board members, but also as members of committees. The Social, Pool, Pond and Grounds committees are always looking for more volunteers to help with all of the activities and upkeep each committee has for each year.

If you have not yet done so, I encourage you to register with eNeighbors (our website). There you will find information on upcoming meetings, social events, classified ads, etc. Registration is easy. Just follow the instructions at the end of this newsletter. Please keep in mind that the only directory that will be available from now on is the directory that you can print from the eNeighbors website that you create by adding yourself to the website.

Please be sure to pick up after your dog when you are walking around the neighborhood. Not only do you need to pick up dog waste from the

street and neighbors yards, but also any common ground area.

Dues invoices were sent out on January 1st. If you did not pay your dues by March 1st, you will be getting a reminder billing and a \$35 late-payment penalty will have been added. The only source of income to Northwood Trails is the annual dues you pay as a member of the homes association. The homes association is legally obligated to provide for certain services to maintain the value of the neighborhood and depends on the dues income for this purpose. If you have not yet paid your 2017 dues, please do so now.

The next board meeting is on March 14th at 7:00 pm. The April board meeting is on the 11th, also at 7:00 pm. We meet at Grace United Methodist Church across the street. As usual, the first 30 minutes is reserved for member input.

GROUNDS COMMITTEE NEWS

Starting out the new year our paid crew, DSLawn will be on board again and they have already cleared much of the over growth around the perimeter of the open field south of the parking lot. Many trees along the stream had low hanging limbs that made it difficult to mow and the brushy growth along the stream tends to take over. Walking along the trail becomes less enjoyable when you have to dodge branches!

The park bench along the trail at the stream was cleaned and stained last year, so please take advantage of this peaceful and scenic seating area.

The second item on the grounds agenda will be to clear out the dead (or dying) locust trees from the Southwest corner of the pool fence. We originally planned to take them out last Fall, but ran out of time and money.

Thirdly, we will have DSLawn repair the damaged turf areas around the outside faucet near the Volley ball court. There is significant work to be done there to get it back to the level it was prior to our Fall sidewalk project. The entire project was not as simple as we had first envisioned. We are hoping it will be worth the mess it caused and that the faucet will function better this Summer season.

Please remember to always clean up after your dogs. The field which I spoke of earlier is a shared community space and is **not an off leash dog park**. There are tons of droppings in that whole field. Please use the doggie bags that are available just west of the parking lot. No matter where you are walking your pets, remember to take a couple of bags just in case. Produce bags from the grocer work great and are easy to chuck in your pocket!

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE NEWS

Understanding neighborhood and city requirements can help NWT homeowners understand the things they need to be mindful of when it comes to maintaining or modifying their homes. Below are a few things to keep in mind.

Did you know? Per deed restriction 5: unsightly projections are not allowed on the front of any home and must be approved prior to attaching to the side or back of any home. This includes but is not limited to air conditioners, basketball

goals, solar panels, satellite dishes, and TV antennas.

Did you know? Per deed restriction 20: other than the normal parking in driveways of automobiles in running condition; storage of other vehicles on any property including on the driveway is prohibited unless stored in the garage. This includes but is not limited to motor homes, camping trailers, boats and boat trailers.

Did you know? Per Olathe Municipal Code all property owners must maintain the exterior of their homes such that there is no chipping, peeling or missing paint. Also, fences including gates, are to be maintained in sound condition free of damage, breaks or missing structural members.

Following the deed restrictions and city codes keeps our entire neighborhood looking great and keeping it attractive to others maintains our property values at the highest levels.
