MONEY MATTERS

VHHA FINANCIAL POSITION

The VHHA income statement for August 2012 statement is included in this newsletter for your review. Larry Engel, VHHA Board Secretary/Treasurer, summed up Verona Hills' overall financial situation: "Keep in mind that at this point in our fiscal year of June 1, 2012 through May 31, 2013, most of our income has come in from dues, but expenses are spread out over the remaining months. However, we expect that our overall financial position has improved since last year. We hope to restore our contingency reserve to the appropriate level, and, assuming the outstanding dues continue to come in, have enough funds to take on some needed capital improvements." VHHA ANNUAL DUES WERE DUE JUNE 1

Thanks to so many of you who paid your dues on time!

A number of residents haven't paid their \$150 assessment yet. If you haven't, won't you take care of that today, while you're still thinking about it?

VHHA will be filing liens at the end of 2012 on properties where homeowners owe \$300 (i.e., haven't paid last year's and this year's dues). This is a costly process, one which we'd love to avoid. Liens can affect homeowners' credit rating. Liens are collected, including the filing cost and interest, when the home is sold or refinanced.

"WHATEVER HAPPENS TO OUR DUES?"

That is an excellent question, one we get asked from time to time. This year, we can tell you in one word where part of our money is going: trees! But read on. . . it's a little more complicated than that. . .

Thanks to Board member Ed McHardie for his tireless negotiating for almost eight months to finalize an agreement between the City of Kansas City and a State Line Road, replace them, and Twenty-seven trees marked with white ground out. (Nineteen additional visible once the project has been contractor to remove the dead and dying trees along then plant additional trees to fill in any other gaps. paint will be cut to ground level; stumps will be stumps can't be reached right now but won't be completed.)

Tree removal and stump grinding will take about two weeks, starting around the week of September 24th, and will be followed by planting. Trees were chosen for their heartiness and resistance to drought (there is no irrigation system) and for how favorably they will blend in to current vegetation. Ed and crew chose 44 eight-foot Junipers, five Vanderwolf pines, five Green Privet, and two Golden Giant Arborvitae.

Working closely with Kevin Lapointe, City of Kansas City Forester, has paid off on this project in more ways than one. Because Kevin approved Verona Hills' plans and had access to funds available for tree removal, City of Kansas City funds paid for tree removal, shaving \$8K off the cost of the project to VHHA homeowners!

Funds will be used to revitalize a few other areas that were victims of the drought as well:

•Wornall and Minor: After removing dead trees/shrubs at the monuments on both sides of the street, the area will be balanced by transplanting surviving plants/shrubs and planting perennial Shasta Daisies in the front to avoid costly planting of annuals each year. • Minor and State Line (monument): Minor makeover by planting perennial Black Eyed Susans to replace annuals. • State Line between Minor and Santa Fe: Clean-up of trash, dead limbs, vines, and weeds (an eyesore to neighbors on adjacent property) and cutting back of low-hanging branches extending out into the sidewalk. •121st Terrace and State Line: The large dying blue spruce in the island just east of 121st Terrace will be cut down and replaced with a Vanderwolf pine. Six dead Junipers behind the Verona Hills monument will be replaced with Yews.

UPCOMING ELECTION: PLEASE VOTE!

The Presidential Election is Tuesday, November 6th. In 2008, almost two out of three (64%) of voting-age citizens voted, up from approximately 60% in 2000. Let's make it a record! (The last day to register to vote is October 10th.)

VERONA HILLS NOT IN 1ST GROUP FOR GOOGLE FIBER

Verona Hills was not included among the first group of "fiberhoods" for installation of Google's high-speed fiber internet and television service. According to local Google officials, areas of Kansas City, Missouri south of I-435, including Verona Hills, will be included in the second rollout of their service. While there is no specific schedule for this next rollout, it will likely be late in 2013. Verona Hills residents can show their interest in this service by visiting the Google fiber website, https://fiber.google.com, entering your street address and email and requesting to be kept informed when Google comes to our area. Doing this may help accelerate the time frame for installation in our area.

FALL LEAF AND BRUSH PICKUP: WEDNESDAY, NOV 28

Sacks and bundles should be curbside by 7 a.m. on November 28 for our next scheduled leaf and brush pickup. For the city's requirements for this pickup, or for more information, go to www.kcmo.org/trash.

TRASH PICKUP DELAYS

Trash/recycling pickups will be delayed one day (moved from Wednesday to Thursday) after the following holidays: Veteran's Day - November 12, Christmas Day - December 25, New Year's Day - January 1, Martin Luther King Jr. Day - January 21, and Presidents' Day - February 18.

NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY / SECURITY

For the last four months, Officer Parson's monthly report of security-related incidents and observations in Verona Hills has included 20 noticeably open doors (garage doors or house doors). For your own safety/security, please remember to promptly close the doors, even when you're home. It only takes a moment for a trained thief to enter your garage or home and remove something of value to you.

NEW SANTA FE (NSF) CEMETERY ADDED TO NATIONAL HISTORIC REGISTER

The wagon swales (aka ruts) in the New Santa Fe Cemetery have been added to the National Register of Historic Places by the National Park Service. This is a rare honor for historic cemeteries which are normally ineligible for this registry. A presentation and celebration of this honor will be held next Spring.

ANNUAL MEETING ISSUE: SIDEWALK REPAIR

The VHHA Board is discussing the issue of using Homes Association funds to repair our neighborhood's sidewalks. Walking around our lovely neighborhood has made the need for sidewalk repair apparent to the VHHA Board. The Board's concerns are 1) neighborhood safety, 2) general appearance, and 3) overall neighborhood property values.

The City of KC considers any sidewalk having a crack 3/4 inch wide or that differs 3/4 inches vertically to be "out of repair" and in need of replacement. Each individual homeowner is legally obligated to repair the sidewalks in front of their residence, at their own expense. If the city were to undertake the repair, its standard procedure is to simply pass the expense on to homeowners. However, it is unlikely that the city has the resources or sense of urgency to initiate a sidewalk repair program to improve our neighborhood.

Because so many sidewalks are in need of repair, the VHHA Board has discussed prioritizing the most dangerous and unsightly sidewalks and attacking the problem over several years. Various ideas are being considered about how VHHA might fund sidewalk repairs. One thought is to share costs with homeowners ... another proposes that VHHA underwrite the entire cost of repairing the most potentially-dangerous sidewalks.

Before the VHHA Board moves forward, however, it would like homeowners to answer this very basic question: *Is paying to repair privately-owned sidewalks an appropriate use of VHHA funds?* Homeowners will be asked to vote up (yes) or down (no) on this question at the Homes Association Annual Meeting November 8.

YOU ASKED ABOUT: OUTBUILDINGS

To respond to many questions we received about installing outbuildings and detached structures in Verona Hills, the Board researched the Homes Association covenants and developed the following policy:

The Verona Hills restrictions clearly prohibit unattached outbuildings in Verona Hills unless approved by JC Nichols. The Board of Directors of the Association, as successor to the right of J. C. Nichols to so act, finds no compelling reason to approve any exception to the general prohibition against outbuildings, and, accordingly, the policy of the Board of Directors is that no approvals will be granted. In the event of violations of the restrictions, homeowners and neighbors will be encouraged to pursue voluntary resolutions. However, aggrieved homeowners and neighbors will be reminded that they have the right to sue on their own behalf to have the restrictions enforced.
